

State, Local, Tribal, Elected and Appointed Officials 2020 Census Checklist

Stay informed . Census Champions is your resource for information and actions on the
2020 Census. If you haven't already, sign up at censuscounts.org/censuschampions.
Look out for emails with relevant information, and invitations to join calls and events
related to the census.
Speak out . Include the 2020 Census and its importance in your remarks and public
communications so that your constituents begin to hear about the census. Encourage your colleagues to champion the census.
Reach out. Meet with regional U.S. Census Bureau staff and partnership specialists to
know what's happening in your community or region.
Help Recruit for Census Jobs. The U.S. Census Bureau is hiring over 500,000 jobs
across the country. They are recruiting in your area. Encourage residents to apply at
2020census.gov/jobs.
Support Complete Count Committees (CCC) . Attend and support your local and
state CCC meetings and planning. If your community does not have a local CCC, work
with local leaders, organizations and residents to create one. Your U.S. Census Bureau
Regional Office can help you to create and train CCCs.
Advocate for funding. Work to identify and appropriate resources to supplement U.S
Census Bureau efforts.
Plan outreach for hard-to-count communities. Identify where your historically
hard-to-count communities are and the strategies and messages necessary to reach
them.
Dedicate staff time. If you're at the local level, ensure there is a dedicated staff
member assigned to census preparations. Meet with and stay engaged with staff to keep
up with local census preparations. For state level officials, ensure your elected body is
dedicating staff time and working with state census staff to coordinate and supplement
preparations.
Know language needs. Identify language needs and identify resources (funds,
pro-bono professionals, local organizations) to support translation and technical
assistance.
Think broad engagement . There is a role for everyone to play. Be sure to engage
media, businesses, philanthropy, faith leaders, and government agencies in the Get Out
the Count effort.
